Shinjiro Hase and the Interim Period between Hanshinkan Modernism and Gutai

Two modern art movements emerged in the first half of the 20th century in the

Kansai region of Japan: Hanshinkan Modernism and Gutai. A 15-year "window"

period existed between the end of Hanshinkan Modernism and the beginning of

Gutai. Unfortunately, not much research has been conducted on the artists operating

during this interim. This paper focuses on the artist Shinjiro Hase, who was active in

the area of drawing in the Kansai region during the window period between the two

movements. In this paper, as the first phase of a larger study, I investigate Hase's

career and works.
