




Distinctive Features of HU

During the course of its long history, HU has developed into a leading research university in Japan specializing in the social sciences. In Japan and around the world, HU has demonstrated its particular strength in academic research that makes practical contributions to improving society. For example, HU has been a leader in research on systemic reforms in public policy, the economy, and law, as well as in business management innovation. HU places equal importance on basic and applied research, aiming to establish a suitable theoretical foundation that leads to effective problem resolution.

All of HU's educational programs have been meticulously prepared to cultivate each student individually, and the University has consequently prepared many promising, talented graduates for society. The faculty is not only deeply involved in cutting-edge research but also closely works with students in small-group seminars of about seven or eight students. The greatest feature of HU is the richness of its high-quality education. Students emerge from this favorable environment with the ability to identify and solve issues on the basis of their in-depth, specialized knowledge and contribute to social, economic, academic, and cultural advancement in Japan and around the world. HU aims to be a world-class education and research center in the social sciences, continuing its esteemed tradition and history while pursuing further sophistication and internationalization of research and education.

Hitotsubashi University Global **Education Program (HGP)**

HGP offers interdisciplinary courses in English, designed for both international and Japanese students. Students can choose from a variety of courses in the social sciences. The program provides in-depth learning opportunities in the fields of Business, Economics, Law, Sociology, IT and others. The program also includes courses specifically designed for exchange students ranging from Japanese language, Japanese Affairs, and seminars (courses with a limited number of students) all conducted in English.

Japanese Language Education

HU offers a variety of Japanese language courses, including those for exchange and research students, those for full-time undergraduate and graduate students, and an intensive preparatory course for government scholarship students.










Center for Global Education and Exchange

Professional Schools

HUB: Hitotsubashi University Business School

Our four MBA programs in Business Administration, Management Analysis, Financial Strategy, and International Corporate Strategy offer students the opportunity to pursue a broad range of studies according to their goals.

Hitotsubashi University School of Law

Our curriculum includes unique courses such as Business Law, as well as externships, in order to nurture legal professionals with a broad legal education and a strong public service ethic.

School of International and Public Policy (IPP)

IPP offers Master's degrees in International and Public Administration, and in Public Economics. The school has four programs: Public Law (PL), Global Governance (GG), Public Economics (PE), and Asian Public Policy (APP). Many GG courses and all APP courses are in English.



Executive Programs

HSEP (Hitotsubashi Senior Executive Program)

Targeted at corporate executives, this advanced management education program offered via a consortium was established in 2002. Students of this program, which has as its principal objective the development of management personnel, go on to join the management teams of major corporations.

HFLP (Hitotsubashi Financial Leadership Program)

The goal of the program is the cultivation of the next generation of CFOs, with an ability to transform the very essence of corporations. Students acquire not only financial literacy, but also a cross-cutting range of the most advanced knowledge and skills.

Institute of Economic Research

The Institute of Economic Research (IER) started its functions in 1940 and was reorganized as an attached institute of HU in 1949. Throughout its history, the IER has generated numerous outstanding research results through the development of databases as well as advanced analysis linked to statistical data. Since 2010, the IER has been serving as a Joint Usage and Research Center accredited by the Japanese ministry of education (MEXT), providing infrastructure for advanced empirical analysis of the Japanese and global economies.

Libraries

Main Library

Hitotsubashi University Library began as a library of The Tokyo Commercial School, the predecessor of Hitotsubashi University, in 1885. Since then, the library has supported the University's research, teaching, and learning activities. The Library has particular strength in the field of social sciences, and its collections include rare historical materials as well as today's important academic resources.

The Library holds about 2.05 million books, 17,000 journal titles, 24,000 e-books, 26,000 e-journal titles.

Center for Historical Social Science Literature

The center holds about 76,200 items of Western rare books on social sciences published mostly before 1850, including the first edition of Leviathan by Thomas Hobbes.



HIAS (Hitotsubashi Institute for Advanced Study)

HU established the Hitotsubashi Institute for Advanced Study (HIAS) in 2014 to serve as a center for worldclass research in the social sciences and a hub for related research networks. There are currently four research centers at HIAS: (1) The Research Center for Health Policy and Economics, (2) The Research Center for Global Economic Systems, (3) The Research Center for Evidence-based Policy Making and (4) The Research Center for Regional and SME Policy. As the headquarters for research at HU, HIAS enhances the caliber and international nature of the HU's social science research and nurtures scholars for the next generation.
